Introduction: Safety and Efficacy

Safety

The animistic tradition: Used safely by indigenous peoples for thousands of years

Relatively non-toxic chemically, compared to other drugs of abuse

Powerful, although generally transient effects

Efficacy

Sixty years of applications

Relationship counseling

Post-traumatic stress disorder

Substance abuse and addiction, especially alcoholism

Depression

Cluster headaches

Childhood autism

Obsessive-compulsive disorder

End-stage psychotherapy with the dying (mostly cancer and more recently AIDS)

Stimulation of the meditative state

Elicitation of mystical experience

The Ten Lessons of Psychedelic Psychotherapy ...Rediscovered

- 1. Each drug has a specific effect.
- 2. Setting can strongly influence, constrain outcome.
- Mindset can transcend or scuttle the effect of drug and setting.
- 4. Dose is important, but less so than setting and mindset.
- 5. Preparation and knowledge enable lasting value.
- 6. Ritual transmits prior wisdom and guides practice.
- 7. Experienced guides reduce fear and increase benefit.
- 8. Re-entry into a supportive social context aids retention.
- 9. Psychotherapy and spiritual practice help integrate insight.
- 10. A revised world view is both a requirement and a result.

Changing Policies and Bureaucracies

The Policy Change Process

Awareness, interest, evaluation, trial, adoption

Quality of the data, costs and benefits, value to interest groups, larger economic, political forces

Web as a lever for change - in policies and in our bureaucratic policymaking infrastructure

Strategic Alignment
